Dear Parents /Carers

Time is flying by; it does not seem that long ago that we were returning after the Christmas holidays and yet we are already half way through the Spring Term. It was good to see so many Year 11s at the Carlisle Skills Fair at the Sands Centre at the end of January. We also held a careers fair in school before half-term. The event was primarily for Year 9s prior to them choosing their GCSE Options. With over 20 organisations participating, we took the opportunity to include all our year groups during break and lunchtime. It was very well attended and the students gained invaluable advice.

In school we have a new careers and apprenticeship board (located outside Mrs Atkinson's Office). This is full of information about open days, events, apprenticeships and careers talks. We are encouraging all students to view all the opportunities on offer.

We held our Year 9 Futures Day before half-term. Small groups had the opportunity to visit Carlisle College and Northumbria University. The majority of students rotated around a carousel of activities including a workshop on Kudos, a HelloFuture workshop and the careers fair. The students all took away valuable advice in advance of them choosing their options. We would like to thank all the employers, training, further and higher education providers who took part making the event a huge success.

Inspira interviews with students continue again next week. We have had so many lovely comments about our students. The interviewers have mentioned that they have been a pleasure to meet and are very polite. Our students are switched on, have all thought about future career plans but are receptive to other career ideas.

### **Procedure for School Closure**

We will only close the school as a very last resort and the default position will always be to stay open. At times some bus routes may be cancelled but the school remains open for those students who can make it. The reality is that there may be occasions when the site is deemed unsafe or we may have insufficient staff that can get into school and in this case we may need to close either fully or for some year groups. If this should happen then the closure will be announced via the school text system, the school website and through local media channels as early as is practical. If you have changed your mobile or email contacts please let the School Office know so that we can update our records accordingly.

## **Attendance**

Whole school attendance at the end of the Autumn Term was 94.81%. Attendance Week 2019 was a success with whole school attendance being 94.78% and we would like to thank you for your support with this. Year 9 had the highest attendance for the week at 95.73%.

There is a clear link between attendance and attainment; students with high attendance make greater progress than those with low attendance. To ensure that no student is left behind, teachers are using strategies to help students catch-up on missed learning but the main responsibility to catch-up lies with the student.

This half term we are launching an after-school Attendance Club. The focus of the work will be catch-up in English, Maths and Science. Students can attend voluntarily or they might be invited. If you have any queries about attendance please contact our Attendance Officer. Thank you for your continued support in improving attendance.

## **Head Lice**

We have had a small number of cases of head lice reported over the last couple of weeks. Please can I ask parents to keep a regular check on their child's hair and if any evidence of head lice is found, treat it accordingly.

## **Behaviour on the School Buses**

We have a high number of students that travel on buses to and from school on a daily basis and as a whole we are very pleased with student behaviour while en route. However occasionally it comes to our attention that students have not been meeting our basic expectations whilst on the buses. There is no doubt that this is the behaviour of a minority of students but I would like to remind all students and parents that under the general power of discipline in the 2012 Education Act, the journey home from school falls under the responsibility of the school. As such we will always follow up reports of unacceptable behaviour on buses when we become aware of issues, which may lead to loss of social time, exclusions or other school sanctions. If you are aware of concerns on the buses, please ask your son/daughter to speak to a member of school staff - Form Tutor, Student Services or Head of Year.

### **Year 12**

Year 12 completed mock exams in early January and Form Tutors are in the process of working with students to support them after they received their results from subject teachers. This involves reflection on where students were successful as well as setting targets to improve. Mock exams are a chance for students to gauge where they are with their initial studies in Year 12 and then use this information to focus on the areas and skills that need to be improved in the final months before the Summer exams. Every year the vast majority of students successfully improve their grades from mocks to final exams with the support of teachers and above all else, a renewed focus on the areas that need to be consolidated and improved. I am sure that Year 12 will learn the lessons from their mocks and work hard over the coming months.

Although it is only term two, we will be starting to work with Year 12 on their plans for after Sixth Form. All of Year 12 will be arranging a work placement for the last week of the Summer term and assemblies will be held to outline this for the students. There are also arrangements in place for outside support to guide students in options. Northumbria University will be running activities in the Summer term to support those students considering applying to universities and we will be also holding events from local providers of higher level apprenticeships in the Summer term.

### **Year 13**

Year 13 have recently completed their mocks exams. Results will follow as well as thorough analysis of the papers in class. The feedback and response to this is a vital step for students to achieve their potential in the A level exams in the summer. Whilst it will be gratifying for students who achieved their targets, there will be improvements to make for everybody. Taking the advice on board and acting on it can make big differences to final outcomes.

There will be briefings by representatives from Northumbria University for 6<sup>th</sup> Form students in the coming weeks, reiterating the need for careful note taking and revision tips prior to the Spring break. The Sixth Form team has had meetings to discuss support for students in registration. Many Year 13s have applied for university places; for those who have not, there will be conversations about next steps and support put in place for those who need it. All students have been given a Kudos Cascaid login. These websites are a source of ideas for next steps to help students narrow down their choices.

Looking further ahead to the end of exams, the date for the prom is Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June. The event is to be held at the Halston hotel, Warwick Road. The cost is £29.95. We will be holding some bake sales to raise the money to pay for the disco.
