I would like to wish you all a warm welcome back to the new school year. An especially warm welcome goes to our new Year 7 parents and to those families whose children have joined us in other year groups. The relationship between students, parents and teachers is fundamental to students achieving their potential and I am very much looking forward to continuing to work with you and your child over the coming year.

We are delighted to be starting the year celebrating the best exam results the school has ever achieved. At GCSE we saw significant improvements, including an increase in those students achieving the highest grades. It was also really pleasing to see good results in History and the Science subjects as both these were identified in the OFSTED report last term. In fact, we feel that had we got these examination results before the inspection then we would have been able to show the inspectors the improvements that had been made and we would have received a better judgement.

We are very proud of our students' achievements in their GCSE examinations. It is especially true this year where there have been even more changes to the examination system, including students having to sit more exams than ever before, the removal of controlled assessments and the introduction of the new grading system across a wide range of subjects. Despite these changes, we are very pleased with our results that are a testament to our students' dedication, resilience and hard work

## **News**

### **Exam Results**

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all our students on their achievements, which are the culmination of years of hard work and study. It was lovely on both results days in August to see so many happy students.

GCSE – Our students achieved the best results the school has ever seen with improvements across many areas. The number of students achieving in Maths and English remains strong; the percentage of students achieving the new grade 4 or above in both these important subjects increased and is likely to be above the national average. Results in the Science subjects were very strong. We are expecting our Science results to be above the national average for the percentage of students achieving two subjects at grade 4 or above. There was also a significant improvement in the percentage of students achieving two subjects at grade 7 or above and this will be at least in line with the national average. The significant improvements in History and results in this subject will be in line with national figures. We were delighted to see the number of our students who achieved the top grades of 7, 8 and 9 increase and as a comprehensive school we are also proud to see that every student will leave with at least 5 or more passes. Results in a whole range of subjects were good, including Music, Drama, Business Studies, System and Religion Philosophy and Ethics.

However we are not complacent and there remains work to be done to ensure every Caldew student realises their potential. I am very ambitious for our students and I have high expectations of what they can achieve.

A level – The schools has a strong track record when it comes to A level results. This year our students did even better and once again, we have seen an improvement in the average grade per entry. We are particularly pleased that a third of our students achieved at least one grade A.

Congratulations should go to all the Year 13 students on their A Level results. All students achieved the grades they needed to move onto their choice of university, higher level apprenticeship or into jobs with training.

### **Information**

#### **Safety at the Start and End of the School Day**

Parking and access to the school is a continuing challenge. The road at the front of school gets very busy especially at the end of the school day and the safety of students is obviously our priority. To that end I would like to remind you that:

- Students should not be picked up or dropped off in the Visitors Car Park (next to Reception)
- Parents picking up students from the Sports Hall Car Park need to park in a designated parking space either by 3:00pm or wait until the buses have departed at 3:20pm
- We do stop cars from leaving the Sports Hall Car Park until all the buses have left. To ensure students safety, no cars should be moving through the car park when students are walking through it to reach their buses
- No cars should be parked in the bus bays along the front of the school at the end of the school day.
- Cars should not stop or park on the footpath opposite the school. It is dangerous for students to cross the road and increases the volume of traffic.
- Parents should never park in the roadway leading to Nestlé. This is a private road and is extremely busy with lorries constantly needing access to the site.
- If parking is not available at school there is a car park a short walk away in Dalston village.

### **Applying for Free School Meals and Clothing Grants**

Free school meals and clothing vouchers are available if parents/guardians are receiving one of the following qualifying benefits:

- Income Support (IS);
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA);
- An income-related Employment and Support Allowance;
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999;
- Child Tax Credit, provided parents/guardians are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs) that as of April 2012 does not exceed £16,190. Note: From 1st May 2009 where recipients are entitled to Working Tax Credit during the four-week period immediately after employment ceases, or after start to work less than 16 hours per week, your children are entitled to Free School Meals, this may be extended.
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit;
- Universal Credit;
- Children who receive Income Support or Income Based Jobseekers Allowance in their own right are also entitled to receive Free School Meals;
- Children who receive "education suitable for children who have not attained compulsory school age" will still need to satisfy the additional requirement of "receiving education both before and after the lunch period", before being eligible to receive free school meals.

### **Attendance**

At Caldew School we believe that attending school regularly is an essential foundation for enjoying school and successful learning because it helps to prepare students for the world of work and adult life. Therefore, we expect every student to attend school and to be punctual.

We are proud that our attendance last academic year reached at 95%. This is almost 1% higher than the previous academic year and is an outstanding milestone for our school community; a milestone that every member of our school community should be proud of and one that we aim to sustain this academic year.

The prestigious Diamond Attendance Certificate for 100% attendance for the whole academic year was awarded to 87 students at the Awards Day in July.

Students arriving to school after 08:4am will complete a 10 minute detention and you will be notified by text. Working in partnership with parents is part of Home/School Agreement found in the Student Planner and on the school website.

### **Holidays and Other Absences in Term Time**

I would like to remind parents as usual at this time of the year of the following extract from the school's Attendance Policy:

*Parents should not book family holidays during term time as they will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances, such as a parent returning on leave from active military service.*

*Parents may request other leave of absence, however, authorisation of this will be at the discretion of the school, and will only be considered in exceptional circumstances. This means that in the majority of cases requests will not be authorised unless there are clear immediate family reasons or educational benefits.*

*Penalty Notices may be issued by the Headteacher against parents who take unauthorised holidays or leave of absence in term time. Each situation will be considered on an individual basis.*

*If leave is granted, parents must appreciate it is their responsibility to ensure their child catches up with any missed work upon their return.*
