One of the standout moments of the term was our Community Christmas Concert on Tuesday night. Other students demonstrated their mathematical prowess when we hosted our annual Primary Maths Challenge day in November, where we were joined by pupils in Year 5 and 6 representing a number of our catchment Primary Schools, from Great Orton, Stoneraise, Kirkbampton, Ivegill, Thursby, Raughton Head, Rosley, Cumwhinton, High Hesket, Cummersdale, St. Michaels, Fell View and Wreay. During the morning, in teams of three, the pupils rotated around maths challenge games which were supervised by Year 7 students. After lunch the pupils all sat the National Primary Maths Challenge paper which challenges problem solving and reasoning skills. Team Challenge winners from the morning were: 1st place - Ivegill, 2nd place - Rosley/Thursby and 3rd place - Kirkbampton.

As we continue with our focus on behaviour for learning we are proud to report a significant increase in student achievement logs, a testament to the positive learning environment and the commitment of everyone involved. We have celebrated this increase with Celebration Assemblies, Reward Parties and The Headteacher Student of the Term, where a student from each year group was nominated by their Head of Year to enjoy breakfast with the Headteacher in recognition of their outstanding achievements and contributions this term, these were Year 7 Rirhandzu, Year 8 Mabel, Year 9 Erin, Year 10 Phoebe, Year 11 Phoebe, Year 12 Joseph & Anna and Year 13 Erin & Freya.
